Unlike the other high priests, he has no need to offer sacrifices day after day, first for his own sins, and then for those of the people; this he did once for all when he offered himself. For the law appoints as high priests those who are subject to weakness, but the word of the oath, which came later than the law, appoints a Son who has been made perfect forever.

#### What you need to know for the future ...

**Baptism** Trinity will keep the feast of All Saints – one of the 4 Sundays the BCP sets aside for baptism – on October 31 this year. Phoebe, the daughter of Samantha Kaplan and Brandon Frumolt, will be baptized on that day. Normally infants and their parents would be enrolled several weeks before receiving the sacrament. Out of an abundance of caution and a desire to limit infants' exposure to possible COVID infection, we will wait to re-institute enrollment to a time when the Pandemic has subsided.

Commemoration of all the Faithful Departed, also called All Souls' Day is an opportunity for us to remember close family and friends who have passed away. The service is on Wednesday, November 3 at 7 PM. Click here to add the names of your loved ones who have passed to the list which will be prayerful recited during the service. During the Sixteenth Century All Souls devolved into a ritual of bargaining with God whereby prayers and masses were offered for loved ones in exchange for the alleviation of their suffering in purgatory. Our Anglican ancestors were rightly suspicious of this bargaining and conflated All Souls into the celebration of All Saints. The 1979 BCP officially restored the observance in the Episcopal Church, renaming it the Commemoration of All Faithful Departed. With the re-naming came a renewed focus on the power and hope of our Lord's Resurrection.

## Stewardship Ministry Minute Delivered by Beth Rees at 10AM on Sunday, October 17

Hi! Good morning! For those of you who don't know me, I'm Beth Rees.

I'm here to deliver this Ministry Minute as a part of Stewardship season. Last Sunday, stewardship packs were delivered in church and then sent via mail. The Stewardship season concludes next Sunday, October 24, with Consecration Sunday and the blessing of pledges.

As I ask you to give your support to the church, I want to talk about what Trinity Church means to me and to my family. We started coming to Trinity when we moved to Cranford in 2012. It was here that I formally joined the Episcopalian Church, after years of attending services elsewhere. My son Gavin started coming to church with me when he was one year old. My daughter Dylan was baptized here.

Over the past 9 years we've moved to a new house. The kids have changed schools more than once. I've been a stay-at-home mom, a grad student, an adjunct professor, and now a full-time high school English teacher. We've weathered two major hurricanes. We're still getting through a major pandemic. Trinity has been our constant through it all.

You don't usually see me in a full church service because I tend to head out in the first few minutes with the Sunday School kids. It's really important to me that our church offers its kids Sunday school classes, a Christmas pageant, youth activities, opportunities to participate in the worship service. The church in Delaware, where I grew up, always felt like home to me. As kids, as teenagers, we felt loved and supported by our congregation. I want all of the kids here at Trinity to experience that same powerful connection, to feel like this church is their home. Trinity's future rests on the shoulders of this young generation, and it's so important to provide them fellowship and community, to manifest God's love through our actions.

Trinity means so much to all of us, for all sorts of reasons. Please think of these reasons as you fill out the pledge card. Thank you.

#### **Lectionary: Proper 25 – Year B**

In the first reading Jeremiah tells that one day God will reach out to his people and call all of them back. No one will be left out, but all will come rejoicing into God's family. The story of the blind man in today's Gospel reading is a sign that what Jeremiah foretold is coming true in the ministry of Jesus. Our second reading continues the letter to Jewish Christians. This was probably written after Jerusalem and its Temple were destroyed, thus there were no more sacrifices offered. The writer reminds his readers that Jesus' own self-offering makes continued sacrifices of animals by fallible human priest no longer necessary. Jesus' one sacrifice of himself is eternally effective for all humanity.

In today's Gospel reading, Jesus heals a blind man. It is the man's faith which gives him his sight. The rules of religion understood blindness to be caused by sin, so this man was excluded from the life of the people. Jesus, however, welcomes him, heals him, and includes him among his followers. In the Eucharist our use of physical bread and wine as the elements of spiritual communion with God remind us of this truth. We become part of the once-for-all sacrifice of Jesus so that we can live in his life eternally. We cannot live apart from God or apart from moral responsibility to all people. In baptism, our spiritual blindness is healed, and we are called to grow into a Body of people committed to justice, reconciliation, and righteous living.
