Alvise Vivarini's *St. John the Baptist* refers to several depictions of the saint by the Venetian Renaissance painter, most notably a slim panel painting (c. 1480) in the Denver Art Museum, known for its cool tones and solitary figure, and a figure within the larger Altarpiece of St. Ambrose, finished by Marco Basaiti, where John stands beside St. Ambrose in the Church of San Pietro Martire (Murano). Vivarini often depicted this saint, sometimes alongside St. Matthew, using detailed hand studies for his figures, creating evocative, characteristic works.
